PRAYERS **MOTION**

SETTTING UP ICT CENTERS IN SHOPPING CENTERS IN MURANG'A COUNTY **Hon. Rebecca Mwicigi:** Mr. Speaker, I am a nominated Member of County Assembly. Allow me to move this motion;

Aware that Information Communication Technology is one of the conduits of Kenya's economic growth, recognizing that ICT plays a fundamental role in our day to day lives, noting that one of the challenges of ICT development is lack of skills, alive to the fact that a large number of our youth at the grassroots in Murang'a do not have a source of income and are not computer literate, noting with concern that most of these youth are not able to access available job opportunities advertised via the internet, recognizing that some of these youth also lack skills to innovatively use ICT as a platform to earn a living through networking or marketing of products; this Honorable Assembly urges the County Executive Member in charge of Education and Child Welfare, Research, Information Technology and E-Government;

- 1. To set up 40 feet containers as IT centers in all shopping centers at the grassroots and equip them with at least five computers and skilled personnel to manage them.
- 2. To also partition the containers into shoe shining spaces and confectionary shops, so that our youth can earn income, stay occupied and become productive.

Mr. Speaker, when I was thinking about this motion, I thought about our youth who are not computer literate because they did not have the opportunities to learn the skills of operating a computer. With the Vision 2030, it is important that everybody of this generation will be computer literate. It is very interesting that you find life very hard if you do not have these skills, that is why people advance in age are trying to learn the computer and the ICT to be literate.

Mr. Speaker, as I said, a 40 foot container provided by the county government will create jobs for about 20 to25 youth and by so doing and five computers are installed in that container, people will be trained on ICT and there will be a teacher.

If one computer is operated by one person, five to six people will be employed by that computer center. You heard that the government gave the directive that everybody who is registered and has a PIN must file their returns by 30th of this month, that means that the youth will be earning some income through filing of the returns for everybody who has a PIN because almost everybody who has an Identification Card (ID) has a PIN; it is a must who does something registers a PIN.

Mr. Speaker, even if they charge a 100 or 200 per person that is money which the youth will earn from there when they are computer literate and they have a computer center.

A village with five computers and they train people up to 14 hours, almost 20 to 25 people would be computer literate per month. Again, our youth have embraced the agricultural farming, if they are computer literate, they will know how the market is behaving, what should be taken where and they will not be cheated by the brokers about what the market is dictating and how much the product is costing.

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Mr. Speaker, these days, everything is being computerized, including job applications, and you are supposed to apply using E-communication. If you are supposed to go and apply, you cannot request someone to apply for you because for sure they cannot write what you were to write.

Being computer literate, these youth will acquire jobs in government. Tenders are being put on the web and need to be applied there; if they are computer literate, I am sure they will get the jobs.

Mr. Speaker, the children of today are being given some Ipads and if you don't know how to assist your child, they won't do their homework. I beg Murang'a county to start the computer schools in the containers so that our people will be able to help their children.

Even in marketing, people are buying from others through the internet. Not being computer literate, you won't sell anything in the local and international market because you won't know how the market is doing.

Rearing of chicken and growing of flowers is being done with the aid of computers, the computer will notify you on how the horticulture is doing in the garden. Like in Netherlands, and I am lucky am talking to people who have visited Netherlands, you saw computers showing the amount of warmth and cold in a greenhouse and by that you are able to harvest the maximum.

Communication and dissemination of information is very important, because if you want to share information as a group, you create just a WhatsApp group and everyone will get the information.

People are raising funds during weddings, chamas, burials and even medical bills through e-communication; some of the youth will be lucky they will be travelling on aeroplanes and trains and you only book your ticket online through e-communication. One saves a lot on energy used in running around and time.

Those who are lucky to have children living abroad communicate very easily, like WhatsApp calls are free, and make the parents and children happy. Easing people with high blood pressure when they communicating directly without people who translate what they should do. With that I ask Hon. Jimmie Kagoni to second the motion.

Hon. James Kagoni: I stand to second this great motion and support it fully as it is. I really urge the house to support the motion. Thank you.

As we have known and specifically even the County Assembly itself and for that reason we have now been able to absorb that particular amount of money and we will not go into books as a County Assembly or a state organ that actually did not absorb the entire amount of money and had to return its own money when actually our own people needed that particular money for one reason or the other.

For that paramount reason or the other this is why I rise to support this motion and congratulate the committee for budget.
