6* NOTICE OF MOTION – (Hon. Beth Wanjiku, MCA Nominated)

AWARE, that Articles 42 (a) of the constitution of Kenya 2010 states that every person has a right to a clean and healthy environment, further aware that part 2 of the forth schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 stipulates that County Public Works and Services including storm water management systems in built up areas and Water and sanitation services is a devolved function of the County Government, cognizant of the fact that major towns in Murang'a County lack proper disposal of storm water and sewerage; this Assembly urges the County Executive Committee member for Transport and Infrastructure, to set aside funds in the FY 2015/2016 budget estimates, for construction of sewerage system in all major towns of Murang'a County.

- 2. Is he also aware that Ithanga and Lower Kakuzi being the most marginalized Wards needs to be served urgently with those pipes to enable the community have reliable water access since pumps have already been supplied by the County Government?
