### 1.3 ESTABLISHMENT AND MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Departmental Committee on Public Works, Roads and Transport is established pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 204.

As a sectoral Committee under these provisions, the Committee is mandated to:-

- (a) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- (b) study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- (c) study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- (d) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- (e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the Assembly;
- (f) to vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 198 (Committee on Appointments); and
- (g) make reports and recommendations to the Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

Pursuant to the fourth schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 and the second schedule of the County Assembly standing order (204), the Committee is also mandated to look into all matters related to;

- a. County transport,
- b. Including county roads,
- c. Street lighting,
- d. Traffic and parking,
- e. Public road transport
- f. Storm water management systems in built-up areas

Committees while preparing their annual workplans, make reference to the legacy reports especially during prioritization of activities, taking into consideration activities not undertaken. They provide an informed basis on how to address the challenges cited during the period under review and how to further mitigate the shortcomings. They assist the committees in putting in place modalities of implementing recommendations made for the better execution of the committees mandate.

### 3.2 Request for statements

The committee received the following requests for statements during the period;

- 1. Request for statement on the condition of bridges, drifts and roads in Ithanga Ward.
- 2. Request for statement regarding the Footbridges and Access Roads in Kagunduini Ward.
- 3. Request for statement on cabro installation at Kiriaini market.
- 4. Request for statement on poor drainage system in Kabati Market, Kagunduini Ward.
- 5. Request for Statement on erecting barriers at strategic points of the roads leading to quarry mines to allow for collection of fees and levies from the lorries.
- 6. Statement on developing an affirmative action policy on roads development for Ithanga, Kakuzi, Makuyu and Kamiti Wards.

### 3.3 Reports and Petitions

The Committee considered and dispensed with 28 reports including public petition reports and forwarded the reports to the County Executive for implementation. (Annex 1).

### 3.4 Committee Sittings

The committee held a total of 198 sittings within the precincts of the Assembly.

### 3.5 Bills

### The Murang'a County Transport Bill, 2019

During the period, the committee introduced the Murang'a County Transport Bill, 2019 which was put on hold to allow for further consultations.

The following observations and recommendations were made on the Bill.

### 1. Inadequate Public Participation

In Accordance to Article 196 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, It was noted that Public participation was not comprehensively undertaken, since the Bill was presented to the public alongside three (3) other Bills. The public had decried that there was no sufficient notice hence they never had time to go through the Bill.

It was further noted that there was no profiling and engagement of major stakeholders of the sector including Matatu Saccos Leadership, BodaBoda Leaders, Tuk Tuk drivers representatives, County Traffic Commander, National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA), the Senate, Nairobi Metropolitan Area Authority (NaMATA), Kenya Law Reform Commission.

### 2. Lack of a clear Governance Structure

It was noted that the Bill lacks a clear Governance Structure since all powers and functions have been vested on the County Executive Committee Member in charge of the Roads, Public Works and Transport Department.

### 3. Integration of Urban Planning and Transport

With formulation of the Nairobi Metropolitan Area Transport Authority (NaMATA) under the Presidential Directive, it was highlighted that Murang'a County is one of the Counties under the Nairobi Metropolitan Area.

In this regard, the need to engage them in formulating the legislation was paramount since it was crucial to integrate Urban Planning and Transport. One of the strategic priorities of NAMATA is to look into decongesting Nairobi and development of a Rapid Bus Transportation.

### 4. Additional Provisions

The Committee noted that the Bill did not make clear provisions for the following critical areas;

- i. Formulation of a County Transport Master Plan
- ii. Formulation of a roads development plan.
- iii. Designation of road reserves
- iv. Road Maintenance Standards
- v. Identification and classification of County roads
- vi. Private roads
- vii. Footways on commercial buildings
- viii. Public Transport Vehicles terminals
  - ix. Clear provisions for motorcycle transport, Bicycles, Tuktuks and Tricycles

### **Existing Regulations in Transport**

In spite of the above observations, the sector is not operating in a Vacuum and is utilizing the National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA) regulations. However, the NTSA regulations need to be domesticated to the County.

### Resolution on the Bill

The Committee **Resolved** as follows;

- 1. **THAT** there should be a **repeat public participation** on the Bill to be done through stakeholder profiling. The Committee should engage the following stakeholders to have their input on the Bill;
  - a. Matatu Saccos Leadership;
  - b. Boda Boda Leaders, Tuk Tuk drivers representatives;
  - c. County Traffic Commander;
  - d. The OCPD;
  - e. National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA);
  - f. The Senate;
  - g. Nairobi Metropolitan Area Authority (NaMATA);
  - h. Kenya Law Reform Commission (KLRC)
- 2. **THAT**, the Committee should put the Bill on hold until all the above mentioned stakeholders are engaged.
- 3. **THAT,** since the Bill has too many proposed amendments, it should be redrafted with consideration of the stakeholders input and in conformity with other existing laws.

### 4.0 Committee Achievements

Some of the committees achievements for the period were as follows;

- 1. The Committee was able to consider and dispense with over twenty-five (25) public petitions and forwarded them to the County Executive for implementation.
- 2. The committee introduced in the Assembly the Murang'a County Transport Bill, 2019.

### 4.1 Committee Challengess

Challenges encountered by the Committee during the period were;

- 1. Compliance with the safety guidelines of the Covid 19 pandemic hindered committee activities such as field/site visits and tours due to the lockdowns experienced.
- 2. Due to Covid-19 pandemic, technical officers were required to work from home and meetings held via Zoom were not effective due to network challenges and online access by Hon. Members.
- 3. The County Executive Department of Roads did not have a CEC for two years hence there was lack of cooperation from the technical officers who were in the department. Numerous correspondences from the Committee requesting for information on various sectoral issues from the department were never responded to.
- 4. Lack of goodwill by the Department of roads in implementing recommendations contained numerous public petition reports considered and approved by the Assembly.
- 5. Limited committee budget allocations hindered effective execution of committee operations especially site visits to various infrastructure projects.

### 4.2 Committee Recommendations;

The Committee made the following recommendations;

- 1. **That** with regards to public petitions, the Committee urges current MCAs to take up the petitions from their respective wards and consider allocating their Ward fund budgets towards addressing the issues.
- 2. **That** the liaison committee in consultation with the Budget and Appropriations committee should increase allocation towards local travel to enable accomplishment of scheduled activities.
- 3. **That** the CEC in charge of roads should initiate modalities for constant engagements with the committee for effective oversight. The committee anticipates better working relations with the CEC.

- 4. **That** the CEC should implement all recommendations contained in the reports of public petitions among other reports.
- 5. **That** CEC should submit quarterly reports to the Assembly to enable the committee deliberate on them.
